What is the Flat Arc Character?

- ✓ The character believes the truth
- ✓ They maintain the truth
- ✓ The use the truth to overcome the lie





The truth your character believes

The protagonist already has a handle on the truth.





The Normal World

Where the Flat Arc story opens with a symbol





The Characteristic Moment

Know something about your protagonist





The First Act

Your primary responsibility will be setting the stage for the coming conflict





The First Plot Point

This major scene is the first turning point in your story.





The First Half of the Second Act

The Flat Arc character is going to spend the First Half of the Second Act getting punished for believing the truth.





The Midpoint

The midpoint is your story's centrepiece





The Second Half of the Second Act

The Midpoint has changed everything for the protagonist.





The Third Plot Point

The Third Plot Point is going to be her low moment – her breaking point.





The First Half of the Third Act

The First Half of the Third Act will be all about the protagonist's reacting to the Third Plot Point.





The Climax

This is where your protagonist puts into play is final assault against the antagonistic force.





The Resolution

As in any type of story, the Resolution exists to prove how the conflict has changed either the characters or the world.
