The Negative Change Arc



The Negative Change Arc #2 - Fall

- ✓ The character believes in the lie
- ✓ They cling to the lie
- ✓ They reject the new truth
- √ They believe in a stronger/worse lie





The Lie your character believes

The protagonist in a Fall Arc will start out believing in a Lie that is holding her back





Symptoms of the Lie

Having trouble finding the Lie? Look for the "symptoms" of the Lie in the character's life by considering her actions and especially her reactions





Your Character's Ghost

Your Character's "Ghost" is something in her past that haunts her





The Thing Your Character Needs

The protagonist in a Fall Arc desperately needs the Truth, right from the very beginning of her story





The Thing Your Character Wants

The protagonist in a Fall Arc is completely driven by the Thing She Wants





The Characteristic Moment

The actual structure of the character arc begins with the Characteristic Moment





The Normal World

The Characteristic Moment is only half of a good character arc's opening





The First Act

The Thing the Character Wants, the Thing She Needs, and the Ghost will be basically the same in both a Fall Arc and a Positive Change Arc





The First Plot Point

Because Negative Change Arcs are about a descent into darkness, they must begin in a place high enough for the story to descend from





The First Half of the Second Act

As always, The First Half of the Second Act is all about the character's reaction to the First Plot Point





The Midpoint

The Midpoint is where it all changes





The Second Half of the Second Act

The tragic premise of the Fall Arc indicates a progression from bad to worse in the Second Half of the Second Act





The Third Plot Point

In one word, the Fall Arc is about failure





The First Half of the Third Act

After the breaking point at the Third Plot Point, the tragic hero will rage futilely against death and its power, rather than rising into a person resurrection





The Climax

The Climax in a Fall Arc will progress with an overwhelming sense of inevitable destruction





The Resolution

The ending scenes in a tragedy are often comparatively short
